Aims and Objects

1. To Uphold the Sacredness of the Body and the Duty of Health; to inculcate a lofty view of the responsibilities of maternity and the duty of every mother to fit herself for the perfect fulfilment of the natural calls of motherhood, both before and after childbirth, and especially to advocate and promote the breast-feeding of infants.

2. To acquire accurate information and knowledge on matters affecting the Health of Women and Children, and to disseminate such knowledge through the agency of its members, nurses, and others, by means of the natural handing on from one recipient or beneficiary to another, and the use of such agencies as periodical meetings at members' houses or elsewhere, demonstrations, lectures, correspondence, newspaper articles, pamphlets, books, etc.

3. To train specially and to employ qualified Nurses, to be called Plunket Sisters, whose duty it will be to give sound, reliable instruction, advice and assistance, gratis, to any member of the community desiring such services, on matters affecting the health and well-being of women, especially during pregnancy and while nursing infants, and on matters affecting the health and well being of their children; and also to endeavour to educate and help parents and others in a practical way in domestic hygiene in general—all these things being done with a view to conserving the health and strength of the rising generation, and rendering both mother and offspring hardy, healthy, and resistive to disease.

4. To co-operate with any present or future organizations which are working for any of the foregoing or cognate objectives.

N.B.—The Society was started as a League for mutual helpfulness and mutual education, with a full recognition of the fact that, so far as motherhood and babyhood are concerned, there was as much need for practical reform and "going to school" on the part of the cultured and well-to-do as there was on the part of the so-called "poor and ignorant."

To the Members,

Ladies and Gentlemen,

We have pleasure in submitting for your approval the Society's Thirty-seventh Annual Report.

The high standard of work previously attained at the Hospital and School of Mothercraft has been maintained and we commend this report for your quiet perusal so that you may learn more of what has been occomplished.

We wish to thank the Doctors who regularly lecture to our Trainees — a very valuable contribution to our Training School. We also desire to pay a tribute to Matron and her staff for their splendid work during the year.

Much time and thought has been put into the Building Fund Appeal by your Executive and a special committee was appointed last year to handle the plans and furtherance of the Appeal.

For the latter part of this year we have been fortunate in having Miss E. Goetze as a Public Relations Officer. She has made it possible for us to have our Appeal more widely known.

The programme of erection provides for the building of a new Hospital block, to be followed by Mothers' Quarters, Kitchen and Dining Room, Trainees' Quarters, and Staff Quarters. Plans for the Hospital Block have now been completed and its estimated cost is in the vicinity of £60,000.

We commend the Appeal to all our members and supporters and most earnestly solicit their co-operation.

The Thirty-sixth Annual Meeting was held on the 11th October, 1956, at which the Minister for Health, the Director of Maternal and Child Hygiene, and the Public Relations Officer of the Hospital and Charities Board spoke. The retiring members of the Executive were re-elected unopposed.

We thank the members of the Auxiliaries for their loyal support, also the generous donors who make it possible for our work to continue. To our Office-bearers and Members of the Executive we pay a tribute for their great help and interest.

Tweddle Hospital Report

In Residence-

The following figures are for the year ended 30th June, 1957:---

Total Admissions— Mothers and Babies Babies only	136 140	
Total numbers given treatment—		276
Mothers and Babies		138

The above number does not include the daily average of one mother and baby, who living in Footscray and nearby districts are referred by Sisters in the Centres or Medical Officers for the purpose of Test Feedings; Instructions in artificial feedings and making of food formulae; and mothercraft instructions in general care with the Babies who deviate from normal but do not need hospitalization.

Weakling babies who have been under the care of a Pedriatrician visit the Hospital once weekly for weighing and inspection for one month after discharge from Hospital. This section of the work is of interest to the Infant Welfare Students, as they can follow the progress of the baby in Hospital and home and later in the centre when they are working with the Centre Sister for a period of their training.

The following grouping will give you an idea of the work done in the past year:----

Pre-and Post-Operative treatment for six Hare-Lip and Cleft Palate Babies whose stay in residence averaged three months over the treatment period. Weakling Babies transferred from The Royal Women's and Footscray Hospitals — 5 - 6 lbs. weight.

Dietetic Adjustments and Stabilization — 1 to 18 months age group. Twins, 5 sets.

Fully breast fed figures are not so high as in 1956, due mainly to the fact that some of the Mothers were discharged from Hospital on 5th or 6th day.

Babies — Weaklings and Premature — these needing special care — Mother not in residence until Babies 6 lbs.

Despite these unavoidable circumstances, Mothers in this District and surrounding areas have co-operated in every way, and it is gratifying to all concerned in the work.

Lectures

Lectures have been given by Dr. V. L. Collins, Dr. Glyn White, Mr. Noel Peverill (Dental Lectures), and Pedriatricians who lectured at Assembly Hall, Collins Street, to Students and Nurses. Our thanks are due to these gentlemen.

Pre-School Lectures

These were given by Miss Stubbs, Pre-School Officer of the Maternal and Child Welfare Department.

Tours of inspection and observation under supervision of Kingsville and Newport Pre-School Centres.

Thanks to Miss James, Newport Centre, and Miss Allison, Kingsville, for their interest, understanding and individual interest in the Mothercraft Nurses under their guidance during training period.

We were sorry to say goodbye to her at the end of her training, but wish her every happiness in her work with mothers and babies.

In August we participated once again in the Lord Mayor's Wattle Day Appeal, selling buttons in the streets of Footscray and visiting shops and factories. The response was so good that unfortunately we ran out of buttons before lunchtime.

For several months, we all worked towards a street stall, which was held in Barkly Street, Footscray, in December. We wish to thank all the firms that so generously gave goods: G. J.
