

To the Members.

Ladies and Gentlemen:

On behalf of the Members of the Council of the Tweddle Baby Hospital we have pleasure in presenting our Fortieth Report, which covers a period of steady progress, both on the Hospital and training sides of our work, and during which the improved facilities of the new hospital block have been fully available. The playground section for toddlers has also been completed and meets a long-felt need. The full service we aim at providing for the better health of mothers and babies in Victoria cannot, however, be achieved until the latter stages of the rebuilding operations are put in hand. To this end the continuing financial help of all our members and supporters is essential so as to reach the objective of our earlier Appeal, and a further £15,000 is needed.

We desire to thank the Government of Victoria, the Minister of Health and the several Departments and Commissions under his control for the part that they continue to play towards confirmation of the new Babies' Hospital and Infant Welfare and Mothercraft Training School, which will be both a credit to the State and a valuable adjunct to its health services generally.

To our Honorary Medical Consultants, to Matron and her Staff, whose interest and untiring efforts make possible the community service detailed later in this Report, we extend our grateful thanks and sincere appreciation. To members of Auxiliaries we say thank you for another year of loyal support and ask for intensified efforts from them during the coming year to help finish the job upon which all of us have set our hearts.

The 30th June, 1960, brings us to the conclusion of a successful year at "Tweddle"—the mothers have greatly appreciated the Toddlers' Wing (for the 18-month to 3-year group) for the daily service for their children as well as the residential service when mother is in hospital.

MOTHERS AND BABIES: 145. Mothers who were able to visit for educational purposes has been a daily average of two (2).

BABIES ADMITTED: 227.

IN RESIDENCE, 30/6/1960: MOTHERS AND BABIES 1. BABIES 13.

During the year fourteen (14) Infant Welfare Students presented for State Final Examination and were successful.

MOTHERCRAFT NURSES: Ten (10) obtained Hospital Certificates and State Registration.

We were pleased to welcome students from The Royal Children's Hospital and Footscray District Hospital and the College of Nursing, Australia, as observers—their visits were of educational value.

HOMECRAFT HOSTEL— "INVERGOWRIE": 75 students obtained the Certificate and were a very interested group.

ROYAL AGRICULTURAL SHOW: The Clinic has been very busy and a help in many ways to mothers during their visit to the Show.

Heinz Co., Carnation Milk Co. and Nicholas Pty. Ltd. donated most generously the necessary foods, etc. Thanks to them all, and also the personnel who so willingly helped during the ten (10) days.

The Infant Welfare Students and Mothercraft Nurses join with me in expressing sincere appreciation for the help and ever ready co-operation from our lecturers during the year.

Building Development

During the year much preliminary work has been done towards the actual building of Stage II — Kitchen, Dining-room and Stores-block, and Stage III — the Nurses' Home — to accommodate increased numbers of trainees and augmented hospital staff. The additional land in Sydney Street required for Stage III has been resumed by the Government for the purposes of the Hospital, and now awaits clearance of old disused buildings, large trees and overgrown garden sections. Discussions have taken place with the Melbourne & Metropolitan Board of Works regarding easements to provide for future drainage plans.

Since the close of the financial year several tenders for Stage II were received and, with the approval of the Hospitals & Charities Commission, the contract has been signed for completion of the work within 30 weeks from late October, 1960. Subject to the availability of finance, it is hoped to be able to follow on with Stage III during 1961.

Thus the Council of the Hospital is proceeding as rapidly as possible with its plans to make the Tweddle Baby Hospital a modern centre for child care and training.
