To the Members.

Ladies and Gentlemen:

In presenting our Forty-first Annual Report on behalf of Members of the Council we desire to express our warm thanks to Matron and her staff and to our Honorary Medical Consultants for making possible another year of valuable and worthwhile community service by our Baby Hospital and Training Schools for Infant Welfare Sisters and Mothercraft Nurses.

With the assistance of the Hospitals and Charities Commission, whose support and encouragement we gladly acknowledge, Stage II of our rebuilding operations has been completed, providing modern diningroom, kitchen and storeroom facilities for the planned extension of our work. Our architects are now engaged upon the preparation of working drawings and specifications of the Nurses' Home, and it is hoped to call tenders for its erection before the end of 1961. Its completion will enable us to increase very substantially the numbers of Tweddle-trained Infant Welfare Sisters and Mothercraft Nurses, for whose services there is such a growing demand and to reduce the present waiting time for prospective trainees – Victorian, Interstate and Overseas.

Our Auxiliaries have actively supported our varied undertakings throughout the year. To them and to all the friends of the Hospital we extend our warm thanks for their unfailing interest and practical help. We need additional money for the remaining stages of the rebuilding programme, including the Matron's Cottage and accommodation for additional Mothers and Babies in residence, and also to meet the rising costs of day-to-day maintenance of our undertaking. The continued participation of all our members is invited, for the ends we serve are both great and rewarding.

Since my last report a busy and most satisfying twelve months have gone, leaving us with a new kitchen block and dining room; these take their place in "A Dream that is coming true" for all devoted to Tweddle's future, in the interest of preventative medicine for the welfare of Mother and Baby.

ADMISSIONS: 207 — Ward Babies, Toddlers and Mothers and Babies. Our wee visitors from the Royal Children's and Women's Hospitals have made the work so interesting for us all.

We all sincerely thank the pediatricians who have given so willingly of their time for lectures, etc.; Dental, Public Speaking personnel, Sewing Mothers, and business people who have assisted in many and varied ways.

INVERGOWRIE HOMECRAFT HOSTEL had 48 students, and with the films, demonstrations, project books and lectures for 12 weeks, they all proved themselves to be good students in Mothercraft.

Members of the Maternal and Child Welfare Department were included as Examiners.

INFANT WELFARE POST GRADUATE STUDENTS, 10 of whom obtained State Registration.

MOTHERCRAFT: 14 nurses were able to register with the Victorian Nursing Council.

Christmas is always a happy time, thanks to all the Auxiliaries that make this possible — also many others who have the interest of Tweddle at heart. Through this report we send our grateful thanks, and with your continued interest and help we will all be together to complete the next 12 months of satisfying and rewarding work.

Thank you one and all for co-operation and understanding of each others' problems during Tweddle's building years.


