To the Members,

Ladies and Gentlemen:

We have pleasure in presenting our Forty-third Annual Report which records a year of broadening and developing service to the Mothers and Babies of Victoria. Our rebuilding programme which commenced in 1958 is nearing completion. The new Nurses' Home is in use and provides very comfortable living conditions for our trainees and nursing staff. We would welcome the assistance of members in building up the new library, which caters for both the training and recreational needs of those in residence. The Matron's Cottage will be available to her in October. The old Nurses' Home has been remodelled and the grounds of both homes put into good order. The final block on the Hospital site for Mothers and Babies in residence is expected to be finished by Easter, 1964.

The increased facilities and up-to-date buildings will relieve Matron and her Staff of many problems and difficulties with which she, in particular, has coped so successfully and cheerfully for so many years, and will greatly assist our Honorary Medical Consultants in their invaluable community service.

During the year, the members of your Council have grouped themselves into two working Committees covering respectively the fields of Finance and Administration with Mr. Fanning as Secretary-Manager of the Hospital and of Public Relations and Auxiliaries' activities, and we are all very grateful to every one who has helped so splendidly over the years.

We desire to thank those members and friends of the Hospital who responded to our appeal for £20,000 last year. We will continue to be dependent upon the goodwill and practical help of everyone in the community who appreciates the value of our work both in the Hospital and Training School and desires its increasing effectiveness.
