Is a Specialist Hospital for the care and treatment of Mothers and Babies.

Mothers and Babies are admitted, in residence, for dietary and other medical treatment, and the education of young mothers. Cases admitted are ex-premature for dietetic stabilisation, infants up to 12 months for dietetic and emotional adjustments, and for pre and post-operative treatment for Hare-Lip and Cleft Palate.

A very interesting and satisfying twelve months has been enjoyed by staff members with the work that has been done for babies from Allambie Reception Centre, Social Welfare Department, Mothers' and Babies' Wing, and Ward patients.

VISITORS

Groups of children have come from suburban and country schools. All have donated clothing for babies and toys for the Toddlers' Wing.

CHILD CARE WEEK

Our first Seminar was held at the Hospital and was well attended. We hope to make this an annual gathering.

MOTHERCRAFT APPLICANTS

Mothercraft Nursing is still a popular choice of career. The changes made in the Course have been appreciated by the students.

MOTHERCRAFT GRADUATES

Eighteen received Hospital Certificate and State Registration. Miss Sandra Ngamsirivatana is the first student from Bangkok to do the Course and will complete same in November, 1966.

PRE-SCHOOL COURSE

Four "Tweddle" students received bursaries from the Maternal and Child Welfare Department for the six months' Course, and have completed it with credit. The accommodation that is provided by the Hospital for these students is greatly appreciated by them and their parents. This course enables the student to have a second Certificate and become a valuable person in child care work.

INFANT WELFARE STUDENTS AUXILIARY

Twenty-six obtained Hospital and State Registration, two with distinction and two with highest marks. The two students from Singapore are now working with the Health Department in Singapore.

The Nurses have taken a great interest this year, in making clothes for the toddlers. The girls assisted with collections on "Wattle Day". A donation of \$200 was made to the Endowment Fund Account.

Very good results by our trainees have been a highlight of the year's efforts. The continued financial support of our friends and supporters has been most encouraging. The Endowment Fund, the earnings from which are to be set aside for the care and maintenance of the buildings, is growing steadily. There is, however, some concern that full use of our excellent hospital facilities has not yet been achieved, due to the rising scale of patient charges determined for us by authorities of the State Government. Ways and means of easing the burden for low-income families must be found as a matter of urgency. During the year, arrangements were made with the Social Welfare Department and Allambie Reception Centre for the dietetic care of babies

awaiting adoption, thus extending the range of our charter services to the Mothers and Babies of Victoria.

The Book of Remembrance, which contains an historical record of the beginnings and subsequent development of our work, is now available for inspection in the Hospital Foyer. We invite all our members and supporters to visit the Hospital and to inscribe their names in a specially prepared Visitors' Book kept in the Main Office adjacent to the Foyer.

We desire to record our warm appreciation of the high standards maintained by Matron Graham, Sister Ballard and the staff, so well and ably assisted by our Honorary Medical Consultants and Lecturers. The continued interest of the Hospitals and Charities Commission, the Department of Health and its Maternal and Child Welfare Branch has again proved indispensable.


