

Donations for the year ended 30/6/76, including \$2067.00 from the Lord Mayor's Fund, totalled \$40,326, \$15,000 of which was donated to the Endowment Fund Reserve. The statement of income and expenditure for the year disclosed a deficit of \$2,270, compared to a surplus of \$16,118 the previous year.

The principal activity of the Hospital during the course of the year was to act as a public Hospital and training school.

- (e) The results of the company s operations in the year ended 30th June, 1976 were not, in the opinion of the Councillors substantially affected by any item, transaction, or event of a material and unusual nature.
- (f) Since 30th June, 1976 to date of this report there has not arisen any item, transaction of a material and unusual nature likely, in the opinion of the Councillors, to affect substantially the results of the operation of the company for the next succeeding financial year.

Since 30th June, 1975 no Councillor has received or has become entitled to receive any benefit by reason of a contact made by the Hospital with the Councillor, or with a firm of which he has a substantial financial interest.

THE TWEDDLE BABY HOSPITAL

The Tweddle Baby Hospital established 56 years ago, is a Training School for Infant Welfare and Mothercraft Students. Refresher courses in Infant Welfare and Mothercraft are also available.

The other purpose of the hospital is to improve and maintain better health and dietary standards for mothers, babies, toddlers and pre-school children in Victoria by instruction and example in the care and management of the following groups in residence:

Mothers with babies who are either breast or artificially fed.

Babies and toddlers who have dietary or emotional problems.

Babies and toddlers as boarders whilst parents are on holidays or mother is ill or hospitalised.

Babies and toddlers for foster care and adoption.

We Interview Mrs. GEORGE FOLWELL

June Folwell's first child was born in April, 1973. June was determined that she wished to breast feed her son, Geoffrey.

Unfortunately the hospital staff were too fully occupied to give the individual attention needed.

The hospital said she would need to bottle feed her son and wished to discharge her. June enquired whether there was anywhere she could go to obtain the necessary help.

A list of hospitals was given. From this list she selected the Tweddle Baby Hospital as is was the one most convenient to her home. Arrangements were made for her admission to "Tweddle".

On the seventh day, June was feeling despondent as sufficient milk was still not coming.

Opposite "Tweddle" is the Footscray Football Ground. It was a Saturday and Footscray was playing "at home". June wanted to go to the match. Matron said, "Why not?" So June went and she became thoroughly immersed in the game. This relaxed her — which was just what she needed.

On her return to "Tweddle" she found the milk supply had improved to the extent that she was able to fully breast feed Geoffrey.

One of the great benefits to her at "Tweddle" was that she was free of household cares, but was still able to see her hus-

band and even to go home to provide a meal for him. June also said that at "Tweddle" she was treated with love and consideration and freed from frustrations.

When her second son was born, she had confidence and was able to feed him immediately; but after three months the mik began to be insufficient.

June had the knowledge many mothers do not have — she knew where to come for assistance. Her second son, Glen, stayed at "Tweddle" for ten days and June came to the hospital each day.

Because she had to care for her first son at home, she could not reside at "Tweddle". Freedom from the responsibility for her failure to satisfy the needs of her second son, corrected the trouble.

Recently, June left her second son again at "Tweddle" for a period of two weeks, so that she, her husband and Geoffrey, could go away for a holiday.

This was a further wonderful benefit she received from "Tweddle".

June feels that not sufficient is known by the public of the services rendered by "Tweddle". Matron and her staff give such love and care to their baby patients that more people should know of the Tweddle Baby Hospital. It would be a great loss to Victoria if "Tweddle" ceased to ever exist, she declared.

We interview Infant Welfare Sister, Miss Myrtle Rawolle

MISS RAWOLLE, who is a South Australian by birth, trained at the Royal Adelaide Hospital.

She came to Victoria in 1930 during Australia's worst depression. After nursing at hospitals in Yarrawonga and Warragul and at the Caulfield Repatriation Hospital, she enrolled at the Tweddle Baby Hospital, graduating in Infant Welfare and Mothercraft Nursing in March, 1931.

After graduation, she spent some years practising in private homes and relieving at various Baby Health Centres.

In 1937, she was appointed Infant Welfare Sister in charge of the Newport Baby Health Centre (Williamstown Municipality).

Miss Rawolle continued at Newport for the next 22½ years until 1960, when she retired. Since then, until April 1975, she relieved at Baby Health Centres. For health reasons she now lives in full retirement.

In the 1930's Baby Health Centres were still in the pioneering stage.

There are now some 763 Baby Health (or Infant Welfare) Centres in Victoria. These centres are financed one third by municipalities and two thirds by the government.

If a mother fails to bring her baby to the centre, the Infant Welfare Sister calls on her. If no one is home she leaves a card asking that the Baby Health Centre be contacted.

Besides watching over the health of all babies and infants up to age 5, the centres provide immunisation from tetanus, diphtheria, whooping cough, small pox, measles and poliomyelitis. Record cards are kept on file until each child attains age 10.

Miss Rawolle says that as she did not own a car, home visits were made by public transport and by foot until her last few years at Newport, when the Council provided a taxi for her use.

Visiting was a very important duty as Infant Welfare Sisters were able to report cases of child neglect or unhealthy living conditions, she recalls.

Not only did Miss Rawolle find her work most interesting but also most important and helpful to mothers and babies.

The average attendance at the centre was 30 to 40 babies daily, with approximately 500 babies on the roll.

Expectant mothers were also encouraged to attend the centre if worried or in doubt.

In November 1946, Infant Welfare graduates of "Tweddle" formed a social and working group for the hospital. They called themselves the Plunket Sisters Welfare Auxiliary. There were 48 sisters at that meeting.

Miss Rawo!le, who is a foundation member of that group, has served both as Honorary Secretary and as President for a number of years in each capacity. She has also been a member of the Council of the Tweddle Baby Hospital for the seven years 1970 to 1976 inclusive.

Infant Welfare and Mothercraft training, in Melbourne, commenced in 1920 at the Tweddle Baby Hospital. It was a pioneer of this work in Victoria.
