REPORT OF THE COUNCIL

The Councillors present their report on the state of affairs of the hospital at 30 June, 1978 and on the deficit for the year then ended.

We report that there was a deficit for the year of	\$23,660

The principal activity of the Hospital during the course of the year was to act as a public Hospital and training school.

In accordance with the requirements of the Companies Act 1961 of Victoria the Councillors state that —

- (a) Before the statement of profit and loss and balance sheet of the company were made out:
 - (i) They took reasonable steps so far as debts owing to the company are concerned to ascertain what action had been taken in relation to the writing off of bad debts and the making of provisions for doubtful debts and to cause all known bad debts to be written off and adequate provision to be made for doubtful debts, and at the date of this report they are not aware of any circumstances which would render the amount written off for bad debts or the amount of the provision for doubtful debts inadequate to any substantial extent; and
 - (ii) they took reasonable steps to ascertain that any current assets of the company other than debtors referred to above were shown in the accounting records of the company at a value which they might be expected to realise in the ordinary course of business, and at the date of this report they are not aware of any circumstances which would render the values attributed to current assets misleading.
- (b) At the date of this report:
 - (i) no charge on the assets of the company has arisen since 30th June, 1978, to secure the liabilities of any other person; and
 - (ii) no contingent liability has arisen since 30th June, 1978.
- (c) No contingent or other liability has become enforceable or is likely to become enforceable within the period of twelve months after 30th June, 1978 which, in the opinion of the Councillors will or may affect the ability of the company to meet its obligations as and when they fall due.
- (d) At the date of this report the Councillors are not aware of any circumstances not otherwise dealt with in this report which would render any amount stated in the accounts misleading.
- (e) The results of the company's operations in the year ended 30th June, 1978 were not, in the opinion of the Councillors substantially affected by any item, transaction, or event of a material and unusual nature.
- (f) Since 30th Jun, 1978 to date of this report there has not arisen any item, transaction of a material and unusual nature likely, in the opinion of the Councillors, to affect substantially the results of the operation of the company for the next succeeding financial year.

One of the Councillors, Mr. W. A. Jamieson, is a member of a firm which acts as printers to the Hospital. Since 30 June, 1977 no other Councillor has received or has become entitled to receive any benefit by reason of a contract made by the Hospital with the Councillor, or with a firm of which he has a substantial financial interest.

This report is made in accordance with a resolution of the Councillors.

THE TWEDDLE BABY HOSPITAL

The Tweddle Baby Hospital established 57 years ago, is a Training School for Infant Welfare and Mothercraft Students. Refresher courses in Infant Welfare and Mothercraft are also available.

The other purpose of the hospital is to improve and maintain better health and dietary standards for mothers, babies, toddlers and pre-school children in Victoria by instruction and example in the care and management of the following groups in residence:

Mothers with babies who are either breast or artificially fed.

Babies and toddlers who have dietary or emotional problems.

Babies and toddlers as boarders whilst parents are on holidays or mother is ill or hospitalised.

Babies and toddlers for foster care and adoption.
