



It was with great sadness that members of the Council heard of the death of Dr. J. Glyn White, C.B.E., on 2 November 1987. At the time of his death Dr. White was an Honorary Medical Consultant to the Hospital and an Honorary Life Member of the Council.

Dr. White was pursuing his post graduate studies in London when the second World War broke out. He attained the rank of Lt. Colonel and was Assistant Director of Medical Services for the A.I.F. in Malaya and, after the fall of Singapore, Medical Officer in Charge of British, Australian and Dutch P.O.W. Medical Services at Changi from 1943–45.

On returning to Melbourne, he became a specialist pediatrician, and held consultant appointments at several of the major hospitals.

In 1960 he was awarded the C.B.E. by Her Majesty the Queen in recognition of his services.

Dr. White was appointed Honorary Medical Consultant to The Tweddle Baby Hospital in 1948 and became a member of the Hospital Committee in 1955.

Despite his busy life, he was always available to advise and care for the little patients at Tweddle and to assist their parents.

We are all grateful for his devoted and outstanding service to the Hospital and his care and concern for little children in our community.



JACOBENA ANGLISS KINDERGARTEN

When asked to write a report as Director of the Jacobena Angliss Kindergarten for 1986/87, I realised how quickly the years have passed as this report will be my third since starting work at this kindergarten.

The importance of play can never be underestimated as this is the child's way of gaining an increasing understanding and sensitivity to themselves, to others and to their environment. As Peter Slade says in his book 'Child Drama':—

"Play is an inborn and vital part of young life. It is not an activity of idleness, but rather the child's way of thinking, proving, relaxing, working, remembering, doing, testing and absorbing."

A comment that is not uncommon from adults when observing children playing is "it doesn't matter, they're only playing." Young children do not learn by sitting down and listening to adults; children learn by doing and, through their interaction with others, gain a greater understanding of their world. The beauty of kindergarten is that children can play in safe and supervised surroundings with a wide variety of play materials and in many different situations.

Observing children at play allows the teachers to gain a greater undertstanding of each child and how he/she is developing. Activities can be planned and guidance given according to each child's area of need, both in a positive and negative sense. Children have distinct personalities and needs and these must be taken into account. My 'Child of the Week' activity gives every child the opportunity to have a special week in which they can bring in photographs of themselves, their family and friends, as well as items that have significance to them. This has been highly successful and will continue throughout the remainder of the year.

The children's enthusiasm has continued to grow and they have eagerly participated in music, language, art and science activities. Their development in all areas has been pleasing to observe and their thirst for new experiences never wanes.

It is essential that parental involvement in the program be maintained. All members of the family are encouraged to participate as much as they can, and their support of kindergarten activities is vital.

My thanks to Lisa Watkins, Marg Hyland and Cathy Tofari and all parents who have been supportive. As an example, a puppet play will be presented to the children soon by the parents!

We have again visited the West Footscray Post Office, the local supermarket and have had visits from the Footscray Dental Clinic, the Ambulance Service and the Lightning Creek Band and will soon be making a trip to the Animal Land farm.

Working with other professionals is important if a detailed picture of the children is to be developed. Staff from the Western General Hospital, Community Services and Pat Agostino have been extremely helpful.

Thank you for the invaluable assistance of Maureen Hobson and Elaine Verkys and the ongoing support of Matron Margot Ballard, the Hospital Committee and Board and the Hospital staff.

Throughout the year I have striven to provide a caring and stimulating environment in which the children can develop. I believe this has been achieved. I look forward with enthusiasm to continuing my work with children and families in the Footscray area.

PRE-SCHOOL FIELD OFFICER

This is my second annual report. When I look back over the last report I realise how my work has changed. As a pre-school field officer one of the interesting and sometimes frustrating things about my work is that constant change. Each day there are new families to meet, new situations to cope with, new problems to solve.

My contact with some families is long term. The children I have worked with at home or whose placement at kindergarten I have supported will take another step and I have the pleasure of seeing them move on to school. Other families I have contact with for a short period of time. They may have moved from interstate and need to know where the kindergarten is or the Maternal and Child Health Sister will suggest the child will benefit from kindergarten. All will be organised and the family may move again. The families' and child's needs are constantly changing.

This year a special needs playgroup was run with the Occupational Therapist and Speech Pathologist from the Footscray Early Childhood Development Programme. Nine 3-year-olds attended for a period of 10 weeks at Allanvale. The group was aimed at children with special needs, one child had a speech delay, another developmental delay, another child had a sister with a disability and playgroup provided a special time all of his own. The children gained more confidence and learned new skills and the parents had established new contacts in the local community. I hope to look at running further groups in other areas.

The government is constantly reviewing and evaluating services to pre-school children, funding is being reduced in some areas and in others hopefully, reallocated. We too need to constantly review and evaluate our work with children so that they and their families may receive the optimum support and assistance in those first five years which are the most important in a child's development.
